- Settings for learning include: inpatient, outpatient and consult services.
- Outpatient rotations also allow for Electrodiagnostic studies, use of botulin toxin for spasticity and ultrasound guided injections for musculoskeletal pain.
- Fellows receive training in symptom management, prehabilitation and cancer survivorship issues.
- Opportunities exist for rotation with Palliative Care, Chronic Pain Management, Psychiatry, Head/Neck, Fatigue, Integrative Medicine, Pelvic Pain Psychology, Orthopedics and Pediatrics.
- The fellowship program offers many formal and informal education opportunities.
